



Estremoz

**Route 01 - Freixo - ES**

This is the easiest route available from this access point and is made up of gentle slopes. Head towards Freixo, where you'll find several services perfect for a rest stop, then take a busy road to Redondo. As you look out onto the landscape, you'll see warehouses and a covered bullring. This route is intertwined with routes 2 and 3.

**Signposted Route**  
 26 Km 220 m 1h20m

**Route 02 Freixo - ES**

A circular route that leads to Freixo, where you'll find several basic services. Head south towards Redondo and then towards Santa Susana. Go past the Alcorvisco stream and cross several properties until you reach the main road from Montoito. Continue to Estrada dos Foros, where you will find routes 3, 5 and 6 heading towards the centre.

**Signposted Route**  
 33,7 Km 275 m 1h45m



**Route 03 Freixo - ES**

A racket-shaped route that leaves Redondo, heading west towards Évora. First, turn back towards Santa Susana, where you'll find several services, then on to Montoito and Aldeias de Montoito. Continue through Casas Novas de Marés and Plas, towards Santiago Maior. Go through Foros da Fonte Seca and Taberna do Pateiro, heading north and back to Redondo.

**Signposted Route**  
 68,3 Km 610 m 3h25m

**Route 04 Freixo - ES**

Circular bike route from Redondo to Estremoz, through Evoramonte. It crosses the Serra D'Ossa, descending to the Convent of São Paulo. The route passes Aldeia da Serra, where you find the Serra D'Ossa Cycling Centre and from where the mountain bike/cross country cycle routes begin. The route carries on to Redondo, where it returns to the start.

**Non-signposted Route**  
 66,5 Km 1020 m 3h30m



**Route 05 Freixo - ES**

A racket-shaped route departing from Freixo, towards Redondo and Estremoz. First, go through Aldeia da Serra and past Saint Paul's Convent. Head down to Estremoz then turn towards Glória and Rio de Moinhos. The route takes you past Quinta do Zambujeiro, at the entrance to the Cycling Centre, and on to Alandroal, Terena, Orvalhos, and finally back to Redondo.

**Non-signposted Route**  
 88,5 Km 1185 m 4h45m



**Route 06 Freixo - ES**

Circular route that takes visitors around the mountain, starting out towards Evoramonte, through Estremoz, heading south towards Rio de Moinhos, therefore connecting all 3 municipalities. Continue to Alandroal, Terena, Hortinhas and Aldeia dos Orvalhos before returning to Redondo.

**Non-signposted Route**  
 105,0 Km 1070 m 5h45m

**Route 11 Borba - GR**

Circular route heading towards the mountains, to the east. Enter Aldeia de São Gregório, with its traditional white houses, and cycle through vineyards until you reach the road. Go past Quinta do Zambujeiro and into Rio de Moinhos, on the north side.

**Non-signposted Route**  
 7,8 Km 100 m 0h30m



**Route 12 Borba - GR**

Circular route that coincides with route 11 for the first 5.5km. Starting in southern Rio de Moinhos, it also takes you through Aldeia de São Gregório. Continue through the vineyards, and head towards Nora once you've passed Quinta do Zambujeiro. Go through Barro Branco and head for Rio de Moinhos, where you will reach the entrance to the Cycling Centre, on the Borba side.

**Non-signposted Route**  
 17,4 Km 305 m 2h30m



**Route 13 Borba - GR**

Circular route that starts at the entrance to Rio de Moinhos, following two routes - green and blue - for the first few kilometres on the road towards Estremoz. Make your way back on the eastern side towards Borba, where the route meets the blue route again in the village of Nora. Follow it back to the Cycling Centre.

**Non-signposted Route**  
 39,5 Km 305 m 2h30m



**Route 14 Borba - GR**

Circular route that connects Rio de Moinhos and Estremoz. Start by heading towards the mountain, following the signposted routes. When you reach Herdade do Burrazeiro, follow the road towards Glória and continue until you reach Estremoz. From there, head towards Borba on main roads, crossing a landscape dominated by olive groves and vineyards. When you get to Nave, follow the blue route back to the Cycling Centre.

**Non-signposted Route**  
 52,6 Km 560 m 3h20m



**Route 15 Borba - GR**

Very difficult circular route that connects Rio de Moinhos and Estremoz, along secondary roads and dirt tracks. Return to Borba through São Bento de Ana Loura, past small farms and corklands. Head across Borba and back to the Cycling Centre through Barro Branco.

**Non-signposted Route**  
 79,9 Km 1080 m 5h15m



**Route 22 Borba - XC**

Although this route is short, it has medium-high technical characteristics. Leave Rio de Moinhos and head towards the mountains, following the signposted gravel paths with excellent panoramic views. Pass Herdade do Burrazeiro and follow the signposted routes back to the Cycling Centre.

**Non-signposted Route**  
 16 Km 280 m 1h20m



**Route 23 Serra - XC**

A demanding route that starts at Aldeia da Serra D'Ossa, heading northwards and crossing the Serra D'Ossa to the West, past the entrance to Rio de Moinhos and then back to the mountains, following the centre's MTB route. Once back in the mountain range, this route cuts through it to the East, down a single track to Aldeia da Serra D'Ossa, approaching the village from the South.

**Non-signposted Route**  
 63,5 Km 1370 m 5h45m

**Route 21 Serra - XC**

Circular route that starts at the entrance of Aldeia da Serra and heads towards Estremoz, making its way through the mountains towards the Aldeia da Serra parish church. Continue through a unique landscape until you reach the summit of the mountain, in São Gens. Make your way back on the other side of the mountain, following the valley southwards and through Aldeia da Serra again.

**Non-signposted Route**  
 14,4 Km 400 m 1h10m



CONDUCT, RECOMMENDATIONS AND PERSONAL SAFETY

- Plan your trip in advance;
- Check the weather forecasts for the dates of your trip, and be aware of any risk indicators and warnings provided by the civil protection services;
- Follow all signs relating to use of the trails, whether due to environmental, maintenance or private reasons, remembering that some of the routes are not signposted and may require you to use satnav or similar tools to cross them;
- Only use trails that are open;
- Leave no trace as you go;
- Ensure you always have control of your bicycle, always wear protective equipment (gloves, helmet, goggles, etc.) and take all the tools you might need with you (pump, spare inner tube, etc.);
- Always give way;
- Beware of motor vehicles on public roads;
- Never scare off animals;
- Always leave gates as you find them. If they were closed when you found them, make sure you close them securely behind you;

**4 Day Cycling Tours Serra d'Ossa 169.6km**

Cycle around the Serra d'Ossa, through Redondo, Alandroal, Estremoz and Borba. This route provides several options of accommodation, allowing you to stretch your tour from 2 to 3 or even 4 days, adjusting the stages to each rider's abilities.

**Redondo-Evoramonte-Estremoz-Borba Section:** Distance 84.57km | Elevation Gain 1027m | Accommodation available at kms 0, 23.8, 41.5 and 84.6.

**Borba-Alandroal-Redondo Section:** Distance 84.93km | Elevation Gain 814m | Accommodation available at kms 0, 17.5, 20.6, 26.4, 34.8, 40, 43, 55 and 85.
